**Description:** This blended learning and field-based experience provides participants with the opportunity to study indigenous peoples' rights through the lived experience of an indigenous community close to the Caribbean coast of Costa Rica. The e-learning course will provide participants with knowledge and awareness about indigenous peoples' rights and contemporary issues related to their protection particularly in the context of globalization. The field visit combines theoretical and normative areas of indigenous peoples' rights with field study, and includes the experience of being hosted for five days by a group of indigenous women from the community. The program is ideal for human rights advocates working with NGOs and civil society organizations, practitioners, academics, and students studying in areas of indigenous peoples' rights, human rights, environment, gender and development.
