This e-learning course provides participants with an understanding of how a gender lens is critical to all elements of peacebuilding, conflict resolution and recovery work, initiatives and policy. It outlines the normative framework around women's rights and peacebuilding, security sector governance, approaches to transitional justice, security policy making and awareness raising on women's and gender issues.

In this six-week course, participants will:



Interact with other participants and the instructors in discussion forums and live webinars

Assess learning through assignments



Earn a certificate of completion for meeting the requirements

After the course, participants will be able to:

- understand how the normative framework around women, peace and security has been put into practice in different regions of the world;
- analyse gaps that hinder a comprehensive, realistic and effective response to gender, peace and security issues;
- critique international interventions on peace and security from a women's rights perspective.
